Localized



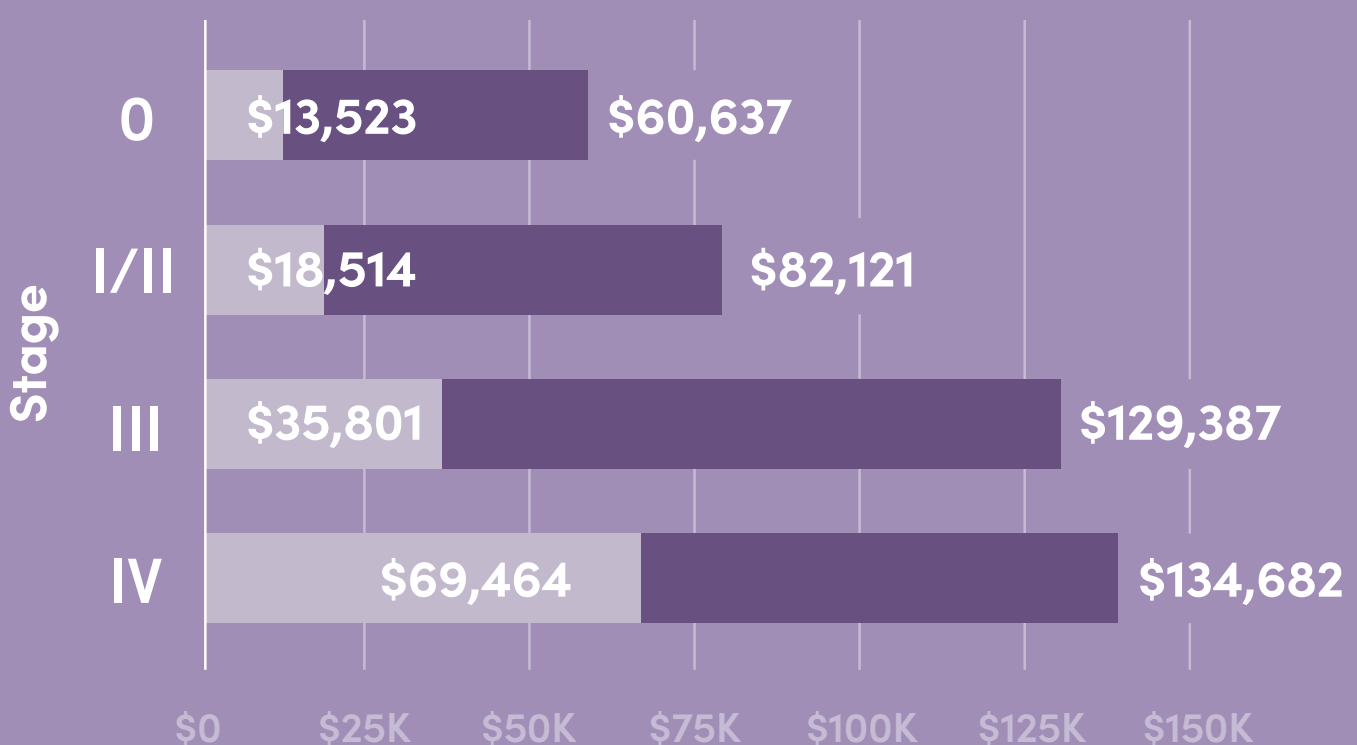
Regional

Between 2019 and 2021, the percentage of new breast cancer cases diagnosed at Stage IV more than quadrupled. It is estimated that more than 10 million patients missed their annual screenings in 2020 during the pandemic; this spike in late-stage diagnosis demonstrates how essential routine screenings are in catching and treating the disease.
